In "The Pit and the Pendulum," Poe apparently had in mind the effects of unrelieved torture and suspense. The story begins with the trial of the narrator, as he sits before seven very severe judges; he is "sick — sick unto death," because the judges have an "immoveable resolution — of stern contempt of human torture."

Weird. Published by Edgar Allan Poe in 1843, "The Pit and the Pendulum" tells the story of a man who's sentenced to death and tortured by the Spanish Inquisition, using – among other things – a razor sharp pendulum that will cut him right in half. What a way to go.

The narrator's fear of oblivion can be seen in his particular abhorrence of the abyss of the pit. Compared to the pit, he labels the pendulum a "milder destruction." He calls the pit "typical of hell" and the "Ultima Thule"—or highest possible—of the Inquisition's punishments; death by the pit is "death with its most hideous moral horrors."

We know what the titular pit and pendulum are meant to do: frighten, torture, and kill. As the narrator notes, however, his jailors could have simply burned him at the stake if they just wanted him dead. No, they want to do something more. They want to make him think. And think he does.
